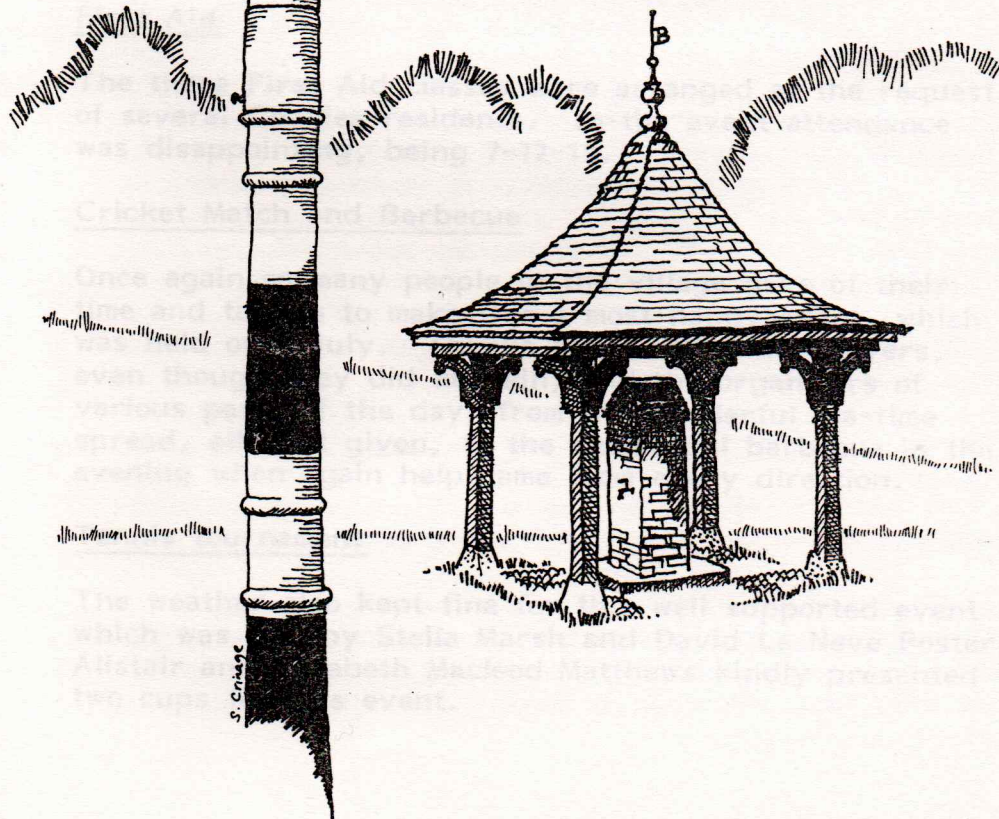
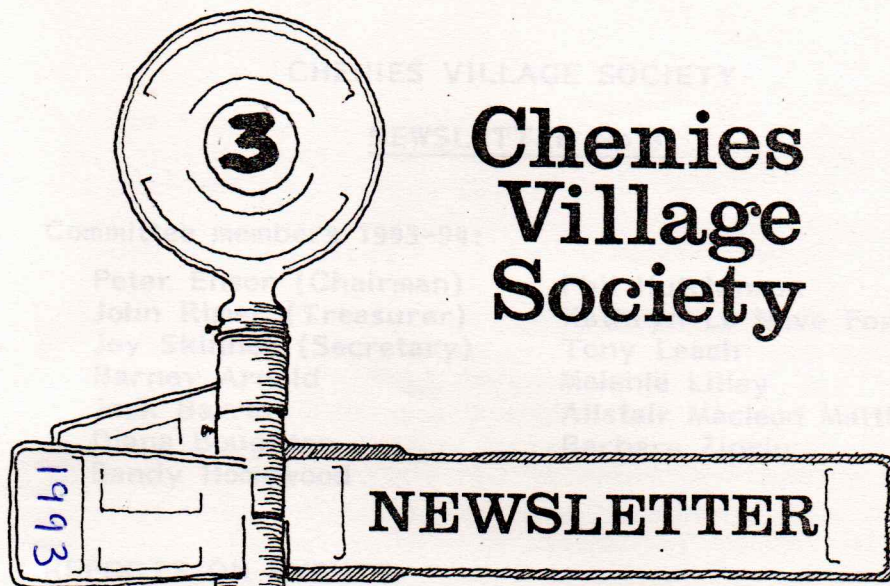

## PARISH NEWS

Traffic and speed: Following the County Council's proposal for the partial closure of the middle road across the Green, the Parish Council is still awaiting the detailed plans which we are advised will be available very shortly.

Kerbing and drainage opposite the Red Lion: This work has recently been carried out after some delay. It appears to have been well done and should protect the verge from further erosion whilst allowing residents and customers of the Red Lion to continue parking along the road.

Verge near the School: This has recently been repaired by Parish Councillors and other volunteers where it had been eroded by parked cars. A quantity of topsoil has been brought in and seeded; additionally, marker posts have been erected to discourage careless parkers.

Grass cutting: This has again been carried out by Mr Ray Lee through the season, and he is to be congratulated on the high standard achieved.

### Pond Clearance

The whole village is grateful to Andy and Sandy Homewood for organising the clearance of the second half of the pond: thanks to all those who helped. More assistance will be required in due course to clear the pond near Claypits, and they will again be looking for a useful response from helpers.
