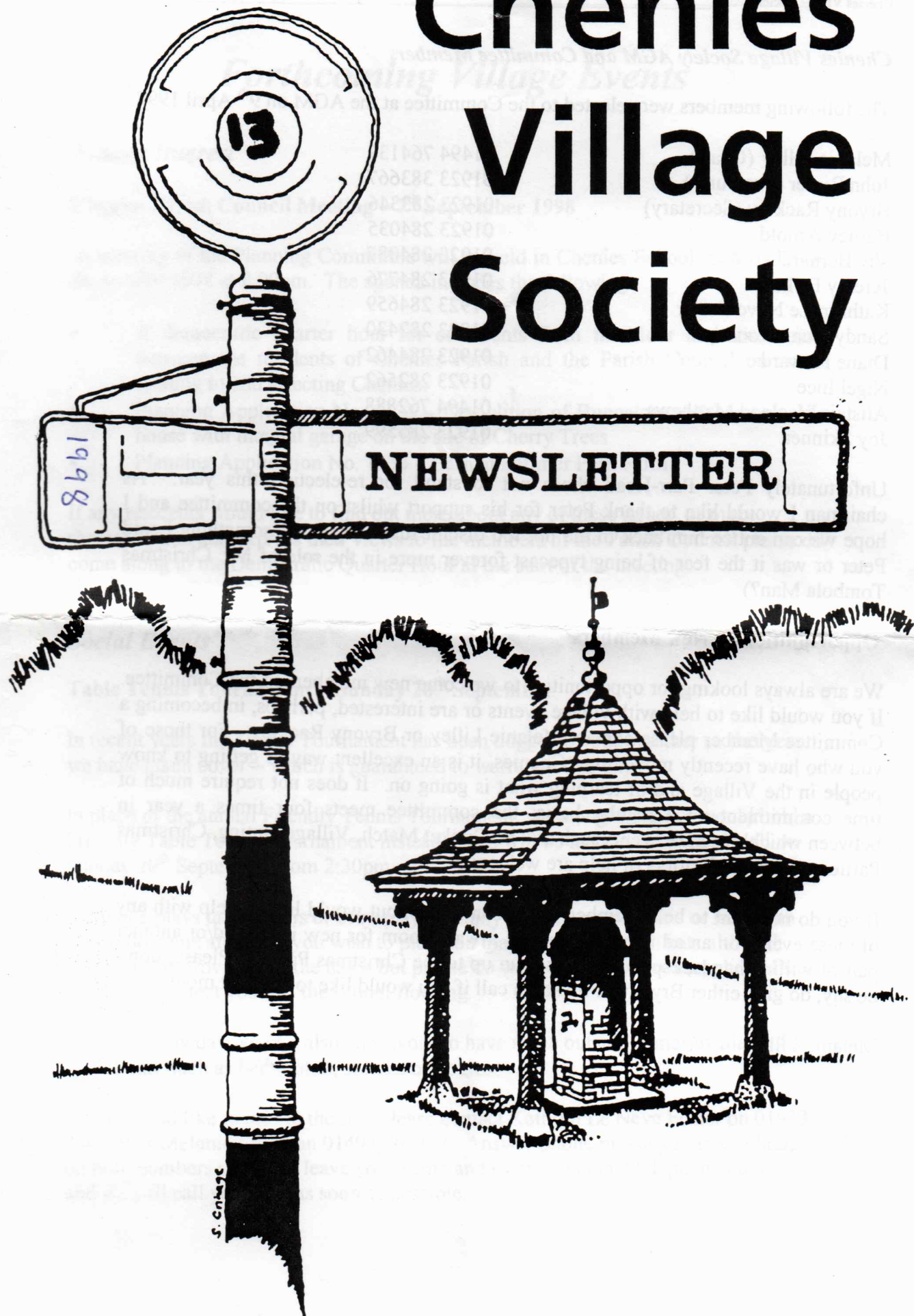

Bedford Close Garages

With reference to your letter dated 12th April 1996, I regret I cannot give assurances that new garage lettings will be tied to occupancy in Bedford Close. Should a garage become vacant and no-one in the close interested in renting it, the garage could not be left indefinitely vacant and would therefore have to be allocated from the waiting list.

The qualifying criteria for garage applicants states that an applicant "should live within a reasonable walking distance of the garage" and hopefully this will ensure allocation to a local resident.

The current lease agreement for garages does contain a clause which prohibits use of the garage for purposes other than storing a vehicle.

However, as I have explained previously, the Association cannot take action to enforce this against lessees who have older leases where the prohibition clause did not exist.

Traffic Calming through the Village

This matter is constantly at the top of The Parish Council's priority list. Having approached Mr. Jim Stevens of Bucks County Council, Mr Stevens drew up a plan and traffic-calming scheme involving gates, road markings, width restrictions and signage. The total cost of the scheme, which only covered one side of the village, would have been in excess of £50,000, none of which could have been implemented without the installation of street lighting. The implications for the Parish precepts would have been significant!

The Parish Council will continue to 'fight this battle' on our behalf.

Millennium Project

Suggestions for Millennium projects have included a stone or attractive wooden seat on The Green and a flagpole for the School, which would be very well received.

In addition, linking into the topic of traffic calming, the idea of specially designed signs at the entrances to Chenies has been suggested. The proposal is that these signs might carry a message similar to the following: 'Welcome to the historic Village of Chenies - Please Take Care of Our Children'. These signs could be one of the village's Millennium projects.

Grants are available for some millennium projects. Before we can apply for a grant however, we do need your views and ideas on what you, the residents of Chenies, would like to promote as millennium projects - also your views about possible social activities. Should we for example have a big Millennium Party or other social event and if so, what and when? All suggestions will be very welcome and can be passed to Nigel Ince, of the Parish Council, Melanie Lilley or Bryony Rackley of the Village Society. These will then be discussed at the Parish Council Meetings and the meetings of The Chenies Village Society Committee and communicated to The Village in future Newsletters for comment.

And Last, but very importantly

'Welcome back' to our policeman, Paul Carr, who has recently returned to Chenies as our local Beat Officer. It's good to have you back Paul - and by the way what are you doing next May Day Bank Holiday (1999) because we've heard a rumour that you may be helping The Village Cricket team to win the cup!
