

WHEREAS the village of Chenies is a picturesque and historic rural community in Bucks., being a conservation area, and in an area of outstanding natural beauty and whereas it is traversed by the road B485 from Chesham via the Chess Valley which is a narrow and weak road with poor alignment and other hazards, including a point only 18 feet in width and

WHEREAS many of the houses of Chenies front onto the said B485 and

WHEREAS the present traffic both of cars and lorries is heavy and increasing and likely to grow by the addition of up to a further sixty four movements per day of heavy gravel lorries through the village from the new mineral workings at Chesham Waterside by Tricentrol Trading Ltd. and Hoveringham Gravels Ltd. and

WHEREAS the increased traffic will cause ever growing noise, danger, disturbance and nuisance to persons and property at Chenies and to the County Councils carriageways and your petitioners believe that much of this heavy goods traffic could more commodiously reach its destination by other routes not passing through Chenies.

NOW THIS PETITION SHEWETH

that the Bucks County Council as Highways Authority should take early steps to limit the number and weight of goods vehicles passing through the village by the imposition of weight and/or access restrictions and/or by other means thus assisting in the preservation of this historic village and the welfare of its inhabitants,
