GENERAL REMARKS AND STIPULATIONS

1. SITUATION

Chenies Estate has been continuously associated with the Russell family since the sixteenth century. The Village was developed during the late 1800's as one of the first garden communities and retains its character today unspoiled by post-war development. It is situated in most attractive countryside on the borders of Buckinghamshire and Hertfordshire, some four miles from Amersham. London is about twenty miles distant and is easily reached by road and by train.

2. SOIL

The soil is basically chalk and gravel with flints giving a free draining, easily worked, fertile light to medium loam.

SERVICES

The Estate as a whole is well served by main Water, Electricity and Gas and by public roads and the River Chess.

TIMBER

All growing timber and timberlike trees are included in the purchase price of the respective lots.

SPORTING

The shooting rights over almost the whole of the Estate are reserved to the Vendor until 1st April, 1955, as to part of the area let and until 1st February, 1955, as to the remainder. After these dates the shooting rights will revert to Purchasers. Trout fishing is available in the Chess. See Special Conditions for rights and liabilities affecting the lots concerned.

TENURE

The whole of the Estate is freehold.

7. AGREEMENTS

Tenancies are, wherever possible, stated in the Particulars. The Agreements or Leases may be inspected by appointment at the offices of Messrs. Humbert & Flint prior to the sale or in the Auction Room.

8. BOUNDARIES, FENCES, Etc.

A well equipped attested dairy and arable farm with a house of great character.

THE FARMHOUSE

This extremely interesting house has a long history extending from the building erected about 1550 by the first Earl of Bedford on the site of an old castle of which there is only a small section of the East elevation, with turret and battlemented wall remaining. It was almost entirely rebuilt in the eighteenth century with a few more recent additions, always in keeping with the original design. Construction is in red brick with tiled roofs and stepped gables and the elaborate chimney stacks are a most attractive feature being partly original but much restored. The house occupies a fine position on a rise just off the Village Green.

Accommodation is as follows:

On the Ground Floor:

Entrance Hall, Dining Room, Drawing Room, Breakfast Room, Cloakroom with W.C. and lavatory basin, Kitchen, Scullery, Pantry, Coal Cellar, two Stores.

Main Electricity, Gas, main Water; part Centrally Heated. Drainage to Cesspool.

THE FARM BUILDINGS

Arranged around three open concreted yards, the well maintained buildings are constructed mainly in brick with tiled or slated roofs. They comprise:

Three single-range Cowhouses with standings for 18, 16 and 12 cows respectively, Dairy, Sterilising Room, Engine House, Corn Barn, six-bay Implement Shed, four-bay Implement Shed and Mixing Room with Granary over, eight-bay Dutch Barn, four Loose Boxes, Bull Pen, Calf House with feeding passage, open-fronted Cattle Shed, Stable and Harness Room, two Stores, double Garage, Wellhouse. They each have two Outbuildings and Garden and share the Washhouse and Well.

- No. 36 OLD HOUSE. An annexe to the Farmhouse, similarly built in brick with a tiled roof. It has Sitting Room, Kitchen, four Bedrooms, Boxroom, W.C., Woodshed, Coal Store and a good Garden. Main Electricity, Gas and main Water are connected and drainage is to a Cesspool.
- THE LONG ROOMS. These two large rooms on ground and first floors are contained in the South wing of the Farmhouse and are used as schoolrooms and for Village Meetings. Main Electricity, Gas and main Water are connected, and there is also a Store Room and a W.C.

THE LAND

Most of the land lies to the South-West of the homestead. Generally, enclosures are easily accessible, of a convenient size, level and well served by public roads and in certain cases by the River Chess. Mains Water is supplied to some fields. The soil is a light to medium loam. Included are a useful number of Oak, Elm, Beech and other hardwood trees.

MILL FARM

94 Acres 0 Roods 4 Perches

An attested Dairy Farm situated on the northern fringe of the Estate in the Chess Valley.

THE FARMHOUSE

An attractive house occupying a pleasant position. Part of the adjoining Mill, which is otherwise disused, has been converted to provide more bedrooms. The whole is built of brick with slated and tiled roofs. Accommodation consists of:

THE FARM BUILDINGS

Most of the buildings stand round a concreted yard and are mainly constructed of brick with slated roofs. They consist of: Two single-range Cowhouses with standings for 10 cows each, open-fronted Cowhouse with standings for 6 cows, Engine House, Barn, two Stables, two Loose Boxes, Calfhouse, open-fronted Cattleshed, Implement Shed and Garage. Main Eectricity is connected to a number of the buildings and main Water to milk production buildings and yard. Note: By an agreement dated 24th January, 1941, the tenant may remove the lean-to Cowhouse for 20 cows, erected by him, at the termination of his tenancy.

THE COTTAGES

There are two cottages:

- 2 CHESHAM ROAD. One of a block of three, this cottage is brick and tiled and contains Sitting Room, Parlour-Kitchen, Pantry, three Bedrooms, Pail Closet, Washhouse and Garden. The Well is shared with all occupiers of the remainder of the block. Main Electricity and main Water are connected.
- 48 THE VILLAGE. One of a pair, built of brick with slated roof. The cottage contains: Living Room, Kitchen, Pantry, two Bedrooms, Boxroom, Coal Store, Pail Closet, and Garden. Main Electricity, Gas and main Water are connected. There is a right to use the well conveyed with the adjoining cottage.

THE LAND

Most of the fields lie on both sides of the Chess near the homestead but there are about twelve acres near the "Bedford Arms" in the Village. The soil is light to medium in texture and the farm is well watered and highly suitable for dairying.

LOTS 66, 67 and 68 (50, 51 and 52 Chenies)

These Lots are sold subject to and with the benefit of the joint use of washhouses, outbuildings, wells, drainage systems and main water stand-pipes (where applicable) and of mutual rights of way and access over yards and gardens to pail closets, washhouses, wells, outbuildings, gardens and public roads, and all other rights as now enjoyed and suffered by the occupier of each cottage.

The Purchaser of any Lot with which any such washhouse, outbuilding, well, stand-pipe or drainage system is conveyed shall take the same subject to the reservation in favour of the owners and occupiers of adjoining and neighbouring cottages to use such washhouse, outbuilding, well, standzpipe or drainage system (as the case may be) in the same manner and to the same extent as hitherto, the joint users thereof contributing to maintenance in equal shares.

No fence or other obstruction shall be erected by any Purchaser which would prejudice or affect in any way the rights of owners or occupiers of neighbouring cottages to the full enjoyment of such rights.

Any dispute shall be referred to the Auctioneers in accordance with Condition 8.

13. Lot 72 comprises the exclusive right of fishing in that part of the River Chess which is coloured blue on a Plan which is held by the Auctioneers and is available for inspection at their offices or in the Sale Room before the Auction, from the following banks of the said river:—

On the right bank of the river, and the fishing in half the river, between the points marked A and B on the said plan.

On both banks of the river between the points marked B and C on the said plan.

On the right bank of the river, and the fishing in the southern half of the river, between the points marked D and E on the said plan.

On both banks of the river between the points marked E and G on the said plan.

On the left bank of the river and the fishing in the whole of the river between the points marked G and H on the said plan.

On both banks of the stream between the points marked F and K on the said plan.

On both banks of the river between the points marked M and N on the said plan.

The following rights will be granted to the Purchaser:

- (a) The right of access and egress from and to the public highways at Chenies shown on the said plan and by such footpaths as have been used hitherto for the Purchaser and his Agents, friends, keepers and workmen and of passing and re-passing along the banks of the said River Chess as above-mentioned for the purposes of the said right and privilege of fishing and other purposes reasonably connected therewith or with the watching and maintenance of the river, but for no other purpose whatsoever.
- (b) The right for the Purchaser and his workmen to trim and lop such trees, bushes and shrubs along the above banks of the said river as are an obstruction to fishing, and also to do such acts and things to the land forming the bed of the said river and the banks thereof and to the weirs thereof as may be deemed necessary to maintain the fishing, but such acts and things shall not cause erosion to the said banks or raise the level of the said river in flood time.
- (c) The right of the Purchaser and his workmen to cut reeds and other water plants that may be detrimental to or an obstruction to the fishing.
- (d) To erect notice boards warning trespassers on the banks at suitable places, and also at suitable places, where required so as to prevent cattle horses and other animals from damaging the fishing, to fence the bank with strands of wire; provided that in exercise of the last mentioned right the Purchaser shall not obstruct the reasonable right of the owners of the lands adjoining the river to water their cattle and animals in the said river. This Lot will be conveyed subject to a covenant by the Purchaser on behalf of himself and his successors in title for the benefit of the adjoining parts of the Vendor's Estate that the Purchaser and his servants and Agents will not at any time do or permit any acts or things to be done or omitted whereby the water in the said river may be polluted so as to cause any injury to the fish in the river or to cattle, to make compensation for all injury done to the owners of the adjoining lands in the exercise of the rights above referred to, and also not to do any act or thing whereby the Vendors or their successors in title or their tenants may be rendered liable to any action or proceedings by any riparian owners or occupiers of the said river.

All the Lots adjoining the said river (viz. Lots 3, 4, 5, 7, 11, 18, 22, 27, 28, 33, 46 and 47) will be sold subject to the above rights for the benefit of Lot 72 and with the benefit of the above mentioned covenant by the Purchaser of Lot 72. All Lots adjoining the said river are sold subject to a covenant to be entered into by the Purchasers thereof that the Purchasers and their successors in title will not at any time do anything which will interfere with or prejudice the said right of fishing or prevent the owner of Lot 72 from obtaining access to the said river in manner above mentioned.

Lot 72 is sold subject to and with the benefit of the existing Lease dated the 25th July, 1953, to Mr. Fermian Le Neve Foster for the term of 7 years from 29th September, 1953 at the rent of £100 a year which Lease is determinable by the tenant on the 29th September, 1956, by giving 6 months notice. This Lease incorporates the provisions of an earlier Lease dated 18th November, 1946.

- 14. Each Lot is sold subject to the restrictions, stipulations and conditions specified in the Particulars, the Stipulations and these Conditions, and the Conveyance to each Purchaser shall contain all proper clauses, covenants and conditions so as to give effect thereto and (where applicable) so as to make the same binding on the Lot into whosesoever hands the same may come and enforceable by the owner or owners for the time being of the Chenies Estate or the part thereof remaining unsold. - 16. (a) The properties are sold on the footing that there is no development thereon in contravention of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, and that the permitted uses under the said Act are the uses respectively applicable to the descriptions specified in the Particulars of Sale.
- (b) So long as allowed by Law and subject to the approval of the Central Land Board, the sale of each Lot includes the right to so much of the claim under Part VI of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947, as may be found appropriate or attributable under the provisions of present or future legislation to the interest in that Lot. Purchasers shall obtain the approval of the Central Land Board at their own expense.
- 17. Each Lot is as regards all coal or mines of coal (if any) as defined in the Coal Industry Nationalisation Act, 1946, in or thereunder sold and will be conveyed subject to all estates interests and rights therein or in any property and rights annexed thereto vested in the National Coal Board or persons deriving title under the Board under or by virtue of the said Act.
- 18. The Conveyance of each Lot shall include a proviso that the Purchaser and his successors in title shall not be or become entitled to any right of light, air, drainage or other easement which would restrict or interfere with or prejudicially affect the free user for building or other purposes by the Vendors or their successors in title of any adjoining or neighbouring land or property forming part of the Vendor's estates.
- 19. Each Purchaser shall in his Conveyance enter into a covenant with the Vendors and their successors in title not to interfere with impede or obstruct in any way the flow of water through any stream, brook, course, ditch or other watercourse which flows through or adjoins his Lot and to take all steps necessary from time to time to cleanse the same so far as the same may run through or adjoin the Lot purchased by him.
- 20. Upon payment of the balance of the purchase money at the time and place aforesaid each Purchaser shall have a Conveyance of the Lots purchased by him from the Vendors, which Conveyance shall be in the form of the Estate Conveyance, amended where necessary. Each Lot is believed to be and is to be taken as being correctly described as to quantity and otherwise and any error, omission or mis-statement found in the Particulars, Sale Plans, General Remarks and Stipulations or Conditions shall not annul the sale or entitle any Purchaser to be discharged from his purchase nor shall the Vendors or any Purchaser claim or be allowed compensation in respect thereof. Provided that nothing in this condition shall entitle the Vendors to compel any Purchaser to accept or any Purchaser to compel the Vendors to convey property which differs substantially whether in quantity, quality, tenure or otherwise from the property agreed to be sold and purchased. This Condition shall take effect in substitution for Clauses 34 and 35 of the Law Society's Conditions of Sale.
- 22. The Stipulations shall be deemed to form part of the Contract but in the event of any inconsistency between such Stipulations and the Special Conditions of Sale the latter shall prevail.
- 23. Clauses 20 (1) and (3), 21, 22 (2), (3), (4) and (5), 34 and 35 of the Law Society's Conditions of Sale shall not apply to this sale.

In Clause 8 (1) of the said Conditions, 21 days shall be substituted for 10 days.
