GENERAL REMARKS AND STIPULATIONS

1. SITUATION

Chenies Estate has been continuously associated with the Russell family since the sixteenth century. The Village was developed during the late 1800's as one of the first garden communities and retains its character today unspoiled by post-war development. It is situated in most attractive countryside on the borders of Buckinghamshire and Hertfordshire, some four miles from Amersham. London is about twenty miles distant and is easily reached by road and by train.

2. SOIL

The soil is basically chalk and gravel with flints giving a free draining, easily worked, fertile light to medium loam.

SERVICES

The Estate as a whole is well served by main Water, Electricity and Gas and by public roads and the River Chess.

TIMBER

All growing timber and timberlike trees are included in the purchase price of the respective lots.

SPORTING

The shooting rights over almost the whole of the Estate are reserved to the Vendor until 1st April, 1955, as to part of the area let and until 1st February, 1955, as to the remainder. After these dates the shooting rights will revert to Purchasers. Trout fishing is available in the Chess. See Special Conditions for rights and liabilities affecting the lots concerned.

TENURE

The whole of the Estate is freehold.

7. AGREEMENTS

Tenancies are, wherever possible, stated in the Particulars. The Agreements or Leases may be inspected by appointment at the offices of Messrs. Humbert & Flint prior to the sale or in the Auction Room.

8. BOUNDARIES, FENCES, Etc.

A well equipped attested dairy and arable farm with a house of great character.

THE FARMHOUSE

This extremely interesting house has a long history extending from the building erected about 1550 by the first Earl of Bedford on the site of an old castle of which there is only a small section of the East elevation, with turret and battlemented wall remaining. It was almost entirely rebuilt in the eighteenth century with a few more recent additions, always in keeping with the original design. Construction is in red brick with tiled roofs and stepped gables and the elaborate chimney stacks are a most attractive feature being partly original but much restored. The house occupies a fine position on a rise just off the Village Green.

On the Ground Floor:

Entrance Hall, Dining Room, Drawing Room, Breakfast Room, Cloakroom with W.C. and lavatory basin, Kitchen, Scullery, Pantry, Coal Cellar, two Stores.

Main Electricity, Gas, main Water; part Centrally Heated. Drainage to Cesspool.

THE FARM BUILDINGS

Arranged around three open concreted yards, the well maintained buildings are constructed mainly in brick with tiled or slated roofs. They comprise:

Three single-range Cowhouses with standings for 18, 16 and 12 cows respectively, Dairy, Sterilising Room, Engine House, Corn Barn, six-bay Implement Shed, four-bay Implement Shed and Mixing Room with Granary over, eight-bay Dutch Barn, four Loose Boxes, Bull Pen, Calf House with feeding passage, open-fronted Cattle Shed, Stable and Harness Room, two Stores, double Garage, Wellhouse. They each have two Outbuildings and Garden and share the Washhouse and Well.

- No. 36 OLD HOUSE. An annexe to the Farmhouse, similarly built in brick with a tiled roof. It has Sitting Room, Kitchen, four Bedrooms, Boxroom, W.C., Woodshed, Coal Store and a good Garden. Main Electricity, Gas and main Water are connected and drainage is to a Cesspool.
- THE LONG ROOMS. These two large rooms on ground and first floors are contained in the South wing of the Farmhouse and are used as schoolrooms and for Village Meetings. Main Electricity, Gas and main Water are connected, and there is also a Store Room and a W.C.

THE LAND

Most of the land lies to the South-West of the homestead. Generally, enclosures are easily accessible, of a convenient size, level and well served by public roads and in certain cases by the River Chess. Mains Water is supplied to some fields. The soil is a light to medium loam. Included are a useful number of Oak, Elm, Beech and other hardwood trees.

MILL FARM

94 Acres 0 Roods 4 Perches

An attested Dairy Farm situated on the northern fringe of the Estate in the Chess Valley.

THE FARMHOUSE

An attractive house occupying a pleasant position. Part of the adjoining Mill, which is otherwise disused, has been converted to provide more bedrooms. The whole is built of brick with slated and tiled roofs. Accommodation consists of:

THE FARM BUILDINGS

Most of the buildings stand round a concreted yard and are mainly constructed of brick with slated roofs. They consist of: Two single-range Cowhouses with standings for 10 cows each, open-fronted Cowhouse with standings for 6 cows, Engine House, Barn, two Stables, two Loose Boxes, Calfhouse, open-fronted Cattleshed, Implement Shed and Garage. Main Eectricity is connected to a number of the buildings and main Water to milk production buildings and yard. Note: By an agreement dated 24th January, 1941, the tenant may remove the lean-to Cowhouse for 20 cows, erected by him, at the termination of his tenancy.

THE COTTAGES

There are two cottages:
