



POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANKS

ABOLITION OF SCHOOL FEES.

Extract from Post Office Weekly Circular.

It has come to the knowledge of the Department that Clergymen and others, interested in the welfare of the classes who will be benefited by the abolition or reduction of School Fees, are making efforts to induce parents, on their being relieved of the payment of such fees, to invest the pence thus saved in the Post Office Savings Bank for the benefit of their children, or to insure their own lives.

With a view of encouraging this movement as far as possible, Postmasters and Letter Receivers are instructed, in the event of applications being made to them, to give every assistance in the way of explaining the facilities for saving afforded by the Post Office Savings Bank, especially by the stamp deposit forms. The aid which is given by the Department to Managers of Penny Banks should also be explained, and, if necessary, applicants should be directed to apply for information to the Controller of the Savings Bank Department.
