SUMMARY OF THE INSPECTOR'S REPORT ON THE SCHOOL AND REMARKS (IF ANY) TO BE MADE.

Boys' School "The Boys have passed exceptionally well in both the Elementary and Class Subjects. The Singing is first-rate, and the general condition of the School is excellent."

Girls' School "The girls have again disappointed me. None of their work is really satisfactory, while the arithmetic is noticeably bad. Of 23 girls examined in the third Standard and upwards, only two have passed well; three have passed fairly, eighteen have entirely failed. The Examination in English was unsuccessful. The Sewing is good, and the order is satisfactory."

Infants' Class "The general condition of the Infants' Division is, I think, fair, though the knowledge
